Rectal and vaginal mesh implants have been given to women, men and even children to treat health issues such as incontinence, prolapse and hernias. Mesh complications can develop years after undergoing the initial procedure

Mesh implant complications can include:



Severe and persistent pain in the abdominal and pelvic areas, the legs and feet





Bleeding



Difficulty or inability to walk



**Bladder** perforation or infection



Vaginal scarring or erosior



nerve trauma



Incontinence



Mesh erosion wounding or protrusion

Mesh implants are made from the same synthetic material, polypropylene, used to make certain drinks bottles



Types of mesh implants include **tension- free vaginal tape** (TVT), **transobturator tape** (TOT) and **mid-urethral slings** (MUS)
