Clinical negligence: facts and figures

During the past three financial years the number of new clinical and non-clinical

claims reported has fallen since peaking in 2013/14.



In 2016-17, the NHS received 208,415 written complaints,

the equivalent of 4,008 written complaints a week or 571 complaints per day.






In 2016, the General Medical Council received 8,197 complaints,

of which 18% were investigated, 6% were sent for further examination and 76% were closed immediately.



In 2016-17, the NHS made clinical negligence payments of £1,707.2 million.

Specific cases



A 2013 report found it took more than a year for **one in five people**

to be diagnosed with bowel cancer after first visiting their GP.
